Here's how the reunion activities shape up so far:

THURSDAY (Sept. 23)—San Diego Trolley Tour. The trolley will pick us up at the Crowne Plaza Hotel and take us on a guided tour of San Diego with eight stops along the way, including lunch at Seaport Village at one of the eight restaurants there. (Lunch is on our own, but discount vouchers are available from the local merchants.) So for a very reasonable price (\$28 per person) we will get passage to and from the hotel, a guided trolley tour of one of the most beautiful and nautical cities on the West Coast, and lunch with our shipmates and mates.

FRIDAY (Sept. 24)—Early reveille will be the order of the day, because we've been called to muster at the ship by 0900, an hour before the USS Midway Museum's regular opening time. We will be welcomed aboard by the President & CEO of the USS Midway Museum, RADM Mac McLaughlin, and Marketing and P.R. Director Scott McGaugh. This "meet and greet" session will include a presentation by Jim Eckel, Director of the Museum's Planned Giving program. We expect opportunities for our reunion group to have a future role in Jim's program. After that we're free to tour the ship and take in the exhibits and rekindle our memories of our days as young "salts" aboard the ship. Possibly some of us could serve as volunteer docents for an hour or two.

SATURDAY (Sept. 25)—On the last day of the reunion, we will hold our biannual business meeting in the morning to review and amend our bylaws, if necessary, and conduct other business. At the reunion banquet in the evening, shipmates, friends and family will gather for pictures and to wine and dine (see registration form for dinner choices). The guest speaker will be RADM Mac McLaughlin to once again show the Museum's support for our reunion efforts. Helen Kruper will present the admiral with her handmade Navy quilt resplendent with pictures of the Midway and the men and their families from previous reunions. Other banquet activities are being planned.

We are looking for hosts and hostesses to help man the hospitality room during the reunion. Duties include keeping food and beverages in supply and the listening to and telling of sea stories, which undoubtedly will be flowing freely. This is guaranteed fun duty, and we can set up shifts. If you're interested please write it on the registration form (it's not a line item) before returning it to President Oscar Granger. Bill "Kroop" Kruper, our Vice President, will be running the Midway Memorabilia Corner. See him for hats, ship's emblems and patches, RD/OS dress blue "Crows" and other items. All memorabilia items are for sale at cost to members and their guests, and all funds go into our reunion account.

At some point during these 3 days, the women may plan an activity together to escape from the men (and who could blame them?).

So, everyone within the sound of this message, we look forward to seeing you in San Diego. It will be soon enough now, about two more months!! Included with this flier is another registration form, in case you misplaced (or never received) the first one that came with the last newsletter. In a couple more weeks, we will be mailing you a message from Oscar, catching us up on the latest news regarding our new position with the USS Midway Museum, and where, potentially, it may be leading us—and, of course, urging us to attend the reunion. It will be our final, final call to register for the reunion.
