MVA Meets with MM on CV-41

On August 18, 2011, Association President Oscar Granger and Membership Committee member Mike Levin met with Midway Museum President and CEO Mac McLaughlin; Marketing Director Scott McGaugh; Education Director Sara Hanscom; and Membership Director Jill Hammons on Midway, to discuss our Association's plans to contribute to the Museum's education and scholarship programs as well as to discuss other business items.

Several positive outcomes came from this meeting; one was the Museum's agreement to let us take an active role in offering Midway Veterans who join our ranks with membership privileges (details still being worked out); in addition, the Museum agreed to let us place our promotional (Veterans Association) postcards on Midway's Quarterdeck, by the veteran's logbook.

This second offer was made good in October when Mike Levin hand-delivered a thousand of our postcards (which were designed by Oscar Granger) to Mac's office, and the postcards have since been placed on the Quarterdeck and made available to Midway Veterans as they check on board. We're hoping to see an increase in new members as a result of these postcards.

2012 Dues Cycle Fast Approaching

Your annual membership dues (donations) for 2012 (\$20) are due by the end of January 2012. To help you keep track of whether you've paid (and we know many of you already have), we'll add a "dues paid" column on our membership roster on the website as well as periodically send you the list of dues payers. If your name isn't on the list . . . well, you know what that means, men – they're due!

We're going to start calling the old reliable term "dues" by a new name: "donations." This is because we're in the process of filing for non-profit status (501c (3)) with the IRS, which will mean that your future "donations," including special donations, such as those we make to the Midway Museum's education and scholarship programs, will be tax deductible.

But whatever you call them, they're due by the end of January 2012. We'll keep you posted!

President's Report

If you haven't already heard, the USS Midway Museum is **big** and getting **bigger**! RADM (Ret) Mac McLaughlin, President and CEO of the Midway Museum, addressed the Port of San Diego recently, proposing a significant expansion of "Navy Pier," which currently contains a 4-story garage and the parking for the Midway Museum. If adopted, Navy Pier would be rebuilt from the waterline up with parking accommodations for about 500 vehicles on a lower level and a 5acre landscaped Veterans Park on the upper level, along with a Community Arts and Events Venue that could become the permanent home for the City's Summer Pops concerts. I encourage every Midway Veteran to take a minute to remind the Port of San Diego of the importance of the USS Midway, not just to the City of San Diego, but also to the nation as THE West Coast symbol of Strength, Freedom, and Peace. An expansion of Navy Pier to honor the Veterans of the United States Armed Forces is an honorable and patriotic project and will strengthen the City's maritime emphasis and its ongoing commitment to the United States Navy and Marine Corps.

I would also like to take a minute to let you know that we've moving forward with the membership drive and have delivered Midway Veterans Associations post cards to the ship in San Diego, to be available for any Midway Veteran who visits the ship. We've been working closely with the Museum staff to allow us to post our Veterans Association cards and information brochures on the Ouarterdeck so that when Midway Veterans do come aboard, they can take a card and send it to us with their contact information. If you happen to have a shipmate or know a Midway Veteran who hasn't joined up vet, let us know and we'll get them a post card and some MVA information to chew on!

Last piece from the "Prez" - with the Holidays rapidly approaching, you don't need to be reminded that we're going to be overwhelmed with the continuous barrage of commercialism that is synonymous with the holiday season. I'd like to add to that barrage with these requests – first, throughout the holiday season and the new year, continue to honor our Veterans for their service and our freedom; second, keep our young men and women

wearing the uniforms of the United States Armed Forces in your thoughts and prayers; and third, consider making a donation to the Disabled American Veterans (DVA) website we sent you in our Veterans Day E-Blast message.

When Ships Were Wood and Men Were Iron

Dick Remington, a machinist mate on Midway from 48-53, sent us an in interesting "technical note" about USN aircraft carrier classes and designations, including the Midway Class. Midway, of course, was the first CVB, built from a **B**attleship hull, that is, the first aircraft carrier with an armored-steel flight deck. There wasn't room in this issue for Dick's entire note, but his career path in the Navy took an interesting twist related to carrier classes, etc.. After serving on Midway for 5½ years, he transferred to the Essex Class USS Tarawa, CV-40, of the old wooden flight deck class. So, in effect, he went backwards in Navy time and technology, from CVB-41 to CV-40, from steel to wood. Wood or steel, it probably didn't make much difference to Dick, since he spent most of his time in the engine rooms of both carriers.
